## **Co-Chairmen of Toledo Campaign Named Toledo Red Light Camera repeal campaign heats up in the cold winter**

The campaign to ban red light and speeding cameras in Toledo got an organizational boost this week with the announcement of two co-chairman of the campaign, and the launch of a web site where volunteers can get information and even download petitions in their home.

The [WeDemandAVote.Com/Toledo](http://WeDemandAVote.Com/Toledo) campaign has been formed to place on the fall ballot a Charter Amendment to effectively ban red light and speeding cameras in the City of Toledo. Currently, the City of Toledo splits revenues with the operator of the private camera company, RedFlex, and plans to extract more than \$3.5 million in red light and speeding camera fines from already-beleaguered Toledo residents in 2009.
